The CELTH Industry Day

Information

You will be assigned to sessions on this day. On your badge, you can find a number for the morning (P1-P11). The parallel labs are numbered in the programme; please follow the corresponding session. P5, for example, refers to "Parallel Creative Lab 5: The Climate is Changing – Is Tourism?".

The same system applies to the afternoon (T1-4 and S2-5). T1 refers to Tour 1, and S2 refers to session 2 in the programme.

Note that T1 and T2 require mobility, as you will either follow a walking tour or need to get on and off boats. Should you be assigned to one of these tours but face some mobility challenges or doubt if these tours are accessible enough for you, please contact us at the registration desk!

About the Day

The CELTH Industry Day is anything but a conventional congress day. Keeping in mind the theme of the day: "From Knowledge to experience: Building Bridges between Science and Industry", a variety of CELTH partners have been invited to collaborate. The programme will not only go beyond keynotes and panel discussions by inviting progressive workshop formats but also allow you to immerse yourself in projects by using relevant technologies and visiting significant places in Breda. This day is packed with participatory programme points and discussion.

Keynote with a twist

Yvonne Nassar will kick off the day by introducing how the Netherlands is reimagining leisure in the face of societal, spatial, and environmental change. It is a kick-off that will show how collaboration between various parties can have a great impact moving forward. Next to that, you will immerse yourself in the resident benefit project that took place in Zeeland, the Netherlands, using silent disco technology.

Parallel Creative Labs

After a small break that gives you time to take a breather, make new connections and discuss the newly won insights, you will follow one of the parallel creative labs. Here, you will listen to a short presentation from one of our partners and dive into their project. In these sessions, your expertise will contribute to discussions about issues and questions that drive the industry. Next to that, the parallel creative labs will showcase the impact those projects have on leisure.

Afternoon Programme

In the afternoon, you will have been assigned to either an on-campus workshop or an off-campus tour. The workshops are designed to provide you with tools that you can apply in your own projects after the WLC, be it scenario planning, storytelling or new approaches to tackle accessibility and inclusion. The tours will bring you into Breda and showcase best-practice examples where knowledge and industry have related to great success. At 16:00, we will round off the day together with a special guest and build the bridge. Afterwards, you will be able to get a drink and snack at a traditionally Dutch "Borrel"

Neuroscience Lab in the Frontier Building: Exit the horizon building towards campus and enter the building in front of you to the left. Once inside, turn left again and find yourself in front of the Lab!
